NOTIFICATION MHT-CET-2010

The Competent Authority has received various representations from some of the students, in particular and in general from public, after the aforesaid examination was over alleging that there were some discrepancies in regard to some of the questions and/or answer options of some of the questions forming part of the question papers of the aforesaid examination. Such objections were raised though the students were not permitted to take away the question paper(s) of the aforesaid examination, after the examination is over.

All such representations/grievances were put before the subject experts. After due deliberation in this regard on the basis of the opinion and advice of the respective subject experts it has transpired that most of these representations/grievances were ill-founded and/or factually incorrect, basically because the same originated on the basis of only the oral information of the examinees.

However to obviate any controversy raised in regard to one question in the subject of chemistry, one question in subject of Biology and one question in subject of Mathematics, the Competent Authority on the basis of the opinion and advice of the respective subject experts has taken a decision to make following three questions non-evaluative.

In the aforesaid facts and circumstances instead of reducing the total number of marks by three marks for PCM group (as in chemistry each question carries one mark and in Mathematics each question carries two marks) the Competent Authority has decided to grant three marks to each and every student/candidate from PCM group, who appeared at MHT-CET-2010 Examination.

Instead of reducing the total number of marks by two marks for PCB group (as Chemistry and Biology each question carries one mark) the Competent Authority has decided to grant two marks to each and every student / candidate from PCB group, who appeared at MHT-CET-2010 Examination.

However it is clarified that the controversial aforesaid question has been made non-evaluative and therefore answer to this question will appear as “ * ” in the key response given to the candidate, if candidate opts for verification.
