PUBLIC NOTICE

Admission to Health Science Courses in Private Unaided Institutions

With regard to the courses of admissions to Health Science courses conducted by Private Unaided Educational Institutions, in Maharashtra, this is to inform all concerned that the Association of Management of Unaided Private Medical and Dental Colleges (AMUPMDC), Parents Association of Medical Students and State Government have concluded an agreed scheme which has been accepted by the Hon'ble High Court, Bombay on 5th May 2006 (in Writ Petition No. 6332/2005)

For the admissions to undergraduate Health Science courses for the academic year 2006-2007, the Association of Management of Unaided Private Medical and Dental Colleges has conducted a Common Entrance Test (CET). With regard to the admission process following the CET, the salient features of the selection process under the agreed scheme are as follows :

Within one week of the declaration of CET results, the AMUPMDC is to submit to the Director of Medical Education & Research, Mumbai (DMER) a copy of the final merit list.

The DMER is to immediately display the same on its website.

One set of option forms received by the AMUPMDC is to be submitted in electronic format to DMER within one week of the last date for receipt of the said forms. Categorywise information regarding the intake capacity of each institution is to be submitted at the same time.

List of provisional admissions proposed to be granted is to be submitted by the AMUPMDC to DMER within 3 days of its preparation.

Within one week of the receipt of the above list, DMER will carry out verification and communicate its non-approval, if any, to the AMUPMDC. DMER may raise objections if any proposed admission is not according to merit.

The concerned institutions shall not grant a single admission in breach of the approval of DMER.

The AMUPMDC is to conduct as many rounds as aforesaid as may be required till the last seat is filled at each institution.

The final list of admitted candidates with all particulars is to be displayed on the AMUPMDC's and DMER's website immediately after final admission.

So far, DMER has not received any information from the AMUPMDC as required under the agreed scheme. DMER has pointed this out to the AMUPMDC. It is only after such information is received and the procedure set out in the agreed scheme is followed that the process of admission can be implemented.

Any admission granted without complying with the agreed scheme will be illegal. Accepting and acting upon such admission/s will not create any rights in favour of any person. It may be noted that the agreed scheme will operate till fresh orders, if any, from the Hon'ble Court.
